REPORT

The Singapore Cardiac Society hosted the inaugural Asia Pacific Heart Rhythm Society Scientific Session (APHRS 2008) in Singapore from 27 to 29 November 2008 at the Raffles City Convention Centre (RCCC). The Symposium saw an overwhelming response of 1,020 registered delegates attending the Symposium.

1. Registration Categories and Fee

To make the Symposium affordable for all Physicians and Allied Professionals to attend, the Organizing Committee priced the fee as attractive as possible to ensure all related professionals can afford to attend the Symposium. Day registrations were opened 1 week prior to the Symposium to cater to the busy schedule for physicians and allied professionals who were unable to attend the full duration.

2. Country Summary

The Symposium saw a total of 1,020 delegates with Singapore (20.98%) as the host country had the largest participating number follow by Japan (18.73%) and China (15.88%).
